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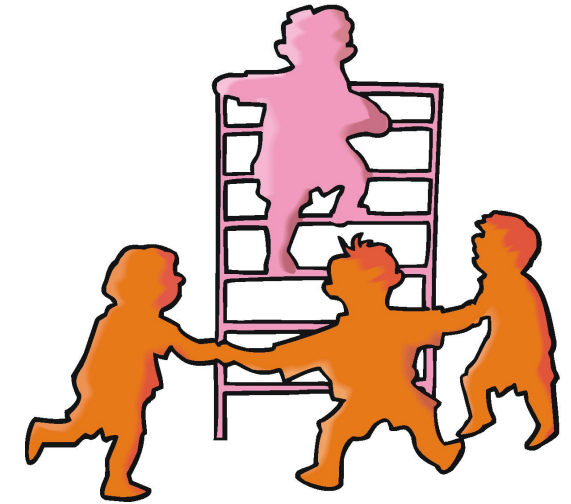

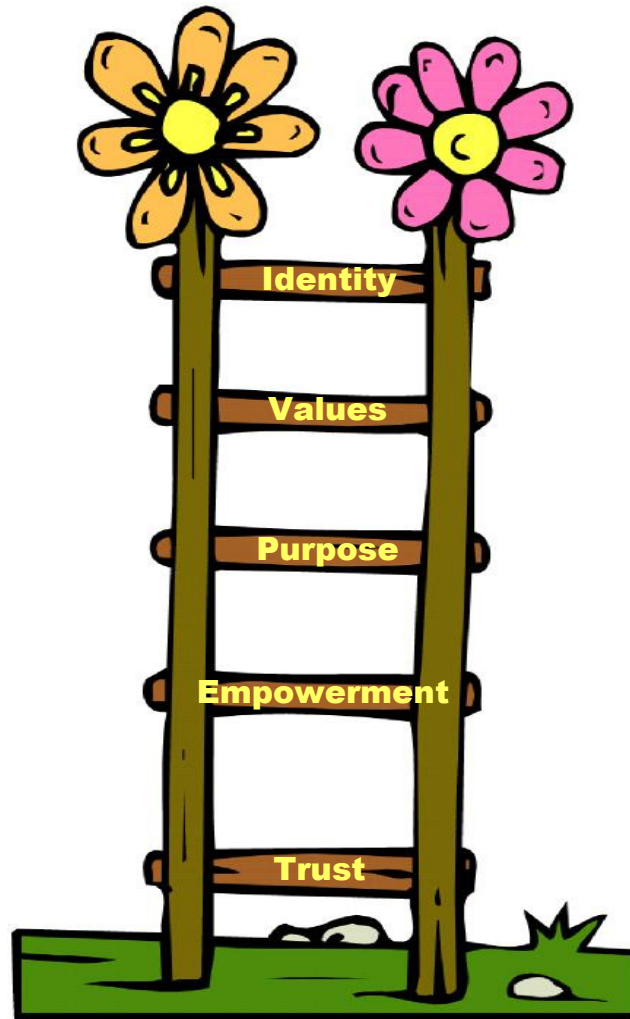
Tell Me About Your Day...

All children have hopes and dreams. The harsh realities of living in their community should not crush a child's dreams or diminish his or her capacity to embrace a future with hope. A child enters the  Jacob's Ladder™ program with a desire to climb up higher and trusting in a dream for success - a dream depicted in the vision of Jacob in the Old Testament of a ladder reaching from earth to heaven...a dream with strong footings in the commands of Christ for **Relationship and Connection**.

The Beltline Youth Enrichment Center and Teen Resource Center are places where the needs of young people are addressed. For eight years,  Jacob's Ladder™ staff, volunteers, and neighborhood stakeholders have been collaborating to introduce vital resources indispensable to the welfare of the Beltline children. Our Centers reach elementary and middle school children as well as older youth each week but there is more work to be done. There are still many more children in the Beltline community who desire relationship and connection.


We work to create an environment of **trust** – trust in each other and in one's own self. Trust leads to empowerment. Through mandating report card information, we monitor academic progress and help children develop knowledge and skills which are integral for their **empowerment**. Owning one's success gives a child a sense of **purpose** and a desire to accomplish more.

When children have the opportunity to learn, they are able to create **values** and the internalization of these values helps to form their **identity**. The ability to make wise choices and resist peer pressure stems from a child's strong sense of "self" and values gained through education and trust relationships.



Ultimately, a child being built-up in the  Jacob's Ladder™ program will have a better understanding of his or her own **identity**, the positive impact one person can make in the world, and a better chance for **success** in life.

**When 'Under Resourced'
Means More Than Money**

The labels "Urban Youth" and "Under-Resourced" youth refer to the same thing - a child growing up in poverty.  Jacob's Ladder™ believes no child should live under these labels of a societal ill. We believe that change is possible and "success" is the label we can place on all people, if they are only given the chance to succeed. Many people can impact a generation. But **one** person *can* make a difference in the life of a child.
